

POND INLET COMMUNITY HALL AND ARENA

The main entrance of this facility is situated on the south side, which faces the central community; it immediately enters into the Lobby/ Viewing area separating the Arena from the Community Hall. The building has been divided into three main components, the Community Hall, Lobby and Service Core and Arena. A heated utility crawl space is provided underneath the service core of the building. Additional height in the roof above the service core provides adequate room for a mechanical mezzanine and fan room. In addition to the main Community Hall and Arena components, the building houses and office, radio room, canteen and workroom situated near the main entrance of the building, providing visual control. Action on the ice surface or in the hall is immediately visible through large glazed walls.

The building has been developed as a pre-engineered structure with special considerations given to the finishes. The pre-engineered structure is being clad with metal in a two-tone configuration using blue/gray, red and white colours as requested by the Pond Inlet Hamlet Council. The blue and white is in keeping with Hamlet colours and identifies the complex as Hamlet owned. It is the pulse of the community. The "Strukturroc" stucco faced wall panels are of galvanized steel and are produced by the pre-manufactured building system supplier. They are compatible with the wall system and will provide a variation in texture that will break up the uniformity of the wall.
